

Guide for online participants

For the online participation, it is necessary:

1. To be registered to the conference, regardless of fee waiver.
2. For **online participant only**: the registration fee* is 15000 JPY to be paid by **November 15**.

* The online participation fee is waived for an Invited speaker or a participant affiliated with official sponsors: CIMEL, CNES, GRASP, ESA, EUMETSAT, JAXA, KCGI, LOA, NASA, PREDE. Further information can be obtained from the organizers.

We might have to reschedule your presentation if the echo or audio feedback make your presentation difficult to hear.

Please mute yourself when you are not presenting.
